## Man arrested for burglary, DUI, domestic battery and restraint

*Oliva-Hernandez arrested after early-morning altercation at Rockridge Apts.*

ARKANSAS CITY, Kan. (January 4, 2016) — An Independence man was arrested early Monday morning after an incident involving burglary and domestic violence at Rockridge Apartments.

Jaime Nain Oliva-Hernandez, 25, formerly of Arkansas City, was arrested by the Arkansas City Police Department on suspicion of aggravated burglary, battery-domestic violence, criminal restraint, disorderly conduct, driving under the influence, intimidation of a victim or witness and theft.

Oliva-Hernandez was transported to and booked into the Cowley County Jail in Winfield in lieu of \$15,750 bond through Cowley County District Court in Arkansas City. He remained in custody at the time of this release.

Police were dispatched about 3:15 a.m. to the apartments at 412 W. Bryant Road for a report of a burglary in progress. The suspect, Oliva-Hernandez, left as officers entered the apartment complex.

He was located and apprehended after failing standardized field sobriety testing during a traffic stop.

Further investigation determined that the suspect had entered the main bedroom of a second-story apartment belonging to the victim, who is the mother of Oliva-Hernandez's child. He allegedly stole the victim's cell phone and keys before waking her and striking her in the face multiple times.

The victim grabbed their child and attempted to flee while calling for help, but fell down the stairs.

The suspect intercepted her, warned her against attempting to contact the police or anyone else for assistance, and told her to go back upstairs. She complied, but entered another bedroom and barricaded herself in.

As Oliva-Hernandez attempted to force his way in, the victim opened a window, removed the screen and jumped approximately 20 feet to the ground below, injuring herself in the process. But she was able to crawl to a neighbor's apartment and contact police.

A defendant's guilt or innocence is to be determined by a court of law.
