## Outdoor Family Movie Series returns July 13 to Paris Park Pool

*Final movie in summer series features free admission; movies to return in fall*

ARKANSAS CITY, Kan. (July 11, 2018) — The 2018 Outdoor Family Movie Series will conclude its summer season Friday in Arkansas City with an animated film at Paris Park Pool, 600 W. Fifth Ave.

The aquatic-themed “swim-in” movie night will kick off at 7 p.m. with free admission to the pool.

Around sunset at 8:45 p.m., the free showing of the Disney animated classic, “The Little Mermaid,” will commence. This G-rated film is cosponsored by the Arkansas City Convention and Visitors Bureau, which will provide free giveaways to event participants, and RCB Bank. It is an hour and 23 minutes long.

In this beloved cartoon classic, a mermaid princess makes a Faustian bargain with an unscrupulous sea-witch in order to meet a human prince on land. While she gains the ability to walk, her voice is lost.

Concessions will be provided by the Arkansas City Recreation Commission and Paris Park Pool.

Friday’s movie will complete the spring and summer outdoor film slate, but a few more free films will be shown in 2018, including a possible movie in conjunction with Arkalalah for the second straight year.

### **About the Outdoor Family Movie Series**

The 2015 Outdoor Summer Movie Series was a huge success in the debut season for the new V.J. Wilkins Memorial Stage at the rotunda, with particularly large crowds viewing “Big Hero 6” and “Frozen.”

The projection equipment, sound system and stage all were made possible by a grant received three years ago from the V.J. Wilkins Memorial Foundation, in order to promote arts throughout the city.

A special fall showing of “Inside Out” drew more than 300 people to the rotunda in November 2015, despite colder temperatures. Plans were launched then for more autumn showings in 2016 and 2017.

Various weather impacted attendance often in the spring and summer of 2016, but the season’s highlight undoubtedly was in June 2016, when more than 700 people packed Paris Park Pool for a special doubleheader, consisting of “Finding Nemo” and “Jaws,” during a free swim-in night at the pool.

The sequel event, featuring “Finding Dory,” drew more than 500 visitors to the pool on July 21, 2017.

The 2018 season kicked off May 5 with the first-ever Saturday night movie, “Coco,” which drew more than 150 people back to the rotunda following the inaugural Cinco de Mayo Salsa Fest event.

Nearly 75 attended the June 12 showing of “Jumanji: Welcome to the Jungle,” the first-ever Tuesday movie, which was shown in conjunction with the Arkansas City Farm and Art Market’s monthly festival.

- Marvel Cinematic Universe films — “Black Panther,” “Doctor Strange,” “Guardians of the Galaxy,” “Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 2” and “Thor: Ragnarok”
- Other animated films — “Despicable Me 3,” “The Lego Batman Movie,” “The Lego Movie,” “The Lorax,” “Minions,” “The Secret Life of Pets” and “Sing”
- Star Wars movies — “Rogue One: A Star Wars Story,” “Star Wars: A New Hope” and “Star Wars: The Force Awakens”
- Summer and holiday blockbusters — “Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them,” “Jaws,” “Jumanji: Welcome to the Jungle,” “Jurassic Park,” “Jurassic World,” “Monster Trucks,” “Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles: Out of the Shadows” and “Wonder”
